

The workshop is part of the project "JUST HOME: Mapping collective housing journeys of gender and criminalization" by Dr. Sarah Gelbard (University of Ottawa). This workshop uses arts-based co-creation as an abolitionist practice of transformative justice; to move beyond just documenting the many intersecting and bi-directional experiences of housing insecurity and criminalization and to imagine possible futures.



Transformative justice is a community-based approach for addressing the systemic reproduction of harm and generating meaningful, transformative solutions by centring the knowledge, experience, capacity, and strength of those most affected.



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
